Saturday July 27<sup>th</sup> 1878  
Fresh Breezes and good weather  
from E Saw Steerbacks Employed  
at various jobs Tides fine  
weather

Sunday July 28<sup>th</sup>  
Fine weather from E Saw a  
great many Steerbacks  
Tides with light-airs and calm  
Lat-19.56 S  
Long 92.30 W

Monday July 29<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced Calm Throughout  
these 24 hours Calm

Tuesday July 30<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced Calm Tides with  
light-airs from W Employed  
Picking over Potatoes and bedding  
a Pen in the Fore Hold

Wednesday July 31<sup>st</sup>  
Commenced with light-airs  
from the Westward, heaving to the  
S Tides with light-airs and  
Calm Lat-19.35 S  
Long 92.56 W

Thursday Aug 1<sup>st</sup> 1878  
Commenced Calm Tides with  
light-airs and Calm Emp  
on the Rigging fore and aft

Friday Aug 2<sup>nd</sup> 1878  
Commenced with light-airs and  
Calm Tides with light-airs from  
E. S. E Employed fitting and Sealing  
off Lower Rigging

Saturday Aug 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Commenced with light-airs and  
fine weather from S. E at 2 Saw  
Whales a long way off lowered 4  
Boats Chased till dark No  
chance going quick to S. E  
Middle the same Tides with fresh  
Breezes and fine weather from the  
Eastward

Sunday Aug 4<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with strong Breezes  
and surge at 1 Saw Breeches  
made all Sails at 2 Made them  
out Sperm Whales lowered 4  
Boats got one Boat-Captain  
took a Whale got it to the Ship  
at 7 Tides with strong Trades  
Cut the Whale and got ready  
to Bail

Monday Aug 5<sup>th</sup>  
Strong Trades and squally  
clear up and started the  
Works on the Head Tides with  
fine weather Employed Boiling

Tuesday Aug 6<sup>th</sup>  
Fine weather and strong Trades  
Boiling Tides the same finished  
Boiling Lat 20.02 S  
Long 92.24 W
