

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer-Off New

Saturday Nov 2nd 1878
Commences clear with light airs
from S.W. land in light middle
light rain squalls and Calms small
with fine weather from N to N.W.
Employed stowing down 70 bbls

Sunday Nov 3rd
Commences with fresh and light
breezes from N and veering to N.E.
land in light. Seas with light
airs from S.W. course N.E. & E
all sail Lat 46.27 S

Monday Nov 4th
Light airs from S.W. course N.E.
at 4 saw one small right whale
lived 4 boats chased till dark
without success. Does hunt to having
S.E. dist. about 40 miles off. Seas
with light airs and Calms

Tuesday Nov 5th
Commences with light baffling
airs and Calms at 4 took a
light breeze from W.S.W. course
N.E. by E all sail. Seas with light
airs from the Westward heading to the E

Wednesday Nov 6th
Commences light airs from S.W.
course E by S. Does hunt dist 40
miles at 4 halloo off then to the
Westward. Seas light airs and
fine clear weather nothing in sight

Thursday Nov 7th 1878
Commences light airs from S.W. with
fine clear pleasant weather. Steaming
different courses from N.E. & Middle
and latter the same

Friday Nov 8th
Fine weather and fresh breezes from
S.W. to S course N.E. by E. Ends with
strong breeze and fine weather from
S. Steaming off to the N.E. for Sierra

Saturday Nov 9th
Strong breezes and fine weather
luffed to the Westward 4 ships
in sight. Seas with strong breezes
and fine weather from S.W. the
same in light and 4 ships

Sunday Nov 10th
Fine weather and fresh breezes
from S.W. Sailed with the Jacob
A. Howland. Seas with fine
weather

Monday Nov 11th
Light breezes from N.W. took
a whale in company with the
James Allen. Seas with
thick and rain took in the whale

Tuesday Nov 12th
Commences with thick bar weather
from N.W. and very S.W. luffed up
the head got ready to fight. Seas
with thick rainy weather from
the Westward. Ends lower backing
