

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of New

2 1/2
Stow

Saturday Nov 23rd 1878
Commenced with strong breezes
and fine weather from S. Nothing
in sight. Middle and Lark the
same strong breezes and regel
saw Right Whales lowered 4 Boats
struck got shore give line to
the Waste Boat. Then came out west
the Whale 3 Boats off repairing L.B.

Lat 46-10 S Long 79-53 W

Sunday Nov 24th
Commenced with light and
a heavy swell running saw
the Fleetwing take a Whale Tons
with Shark Sails lowered 3 Boats
for Whales but to regel had to
take them up again

2 1/2

Monday Nov 25th
Strong Sails from N.W. here
to Storm Sails Tons with a
Sail from N.W. saw Whales and
lowered 3 Boats to regel had to
call the Boats on board finished
repairing the L.B.

Tuesday Nov 26th
Blowing strong from N.W. saw
Whales lowered without success
Middle fresh Sails Tons with strong
breezes and fine weather from
West saw nothing but one sail
Lat 46-19 S
Long 78-09 W

Wednesday Nov 27th 1878
Commenced with strong breezes
and fine weather from W. Sailed
with the Fleetwing Tons with fine
weather from W one sail in light.

Thursday Nov 28th
Fine weather and light breeze from
W and veering to W.N.W. Nothing
in light but one sail Tons with
fine weather from S.W. by the wind
Oposite Sacks all sail 2 sails in
light
Lat 45-59 S
Long 79-45 W

Friday Nov 29th
Strong breezes from S.W. and fine
weather from S.W. 2 sails in light
saw the J.A. Howland take a
Whale Tons with a fresh sail
with thick sunny weather from
W by the wind to the southward

Saturday Nov 30th
Commenced with a fresh sail
and thick foggy weather from
W.S.W. by the wind 1 sheet sail
Tons with a strong sail with
thick rainy weather

Sunday December 1st 1878
Commenced with a strong sail
thick and rainy. Nothing in sight
Tons fine weather from S.W. Lat
30. Sails full and shankers saw
4 sails
