

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of New

Monday Dec 2nd 1878
Commenced with fine weather and
light breezes from S by the wind to
the eastward Middle the same ends
Calm

Tuesday Dec 3rd
Commenced with light breezes
from the N and veering to the
Westward with foggy and rain
ends fine with light breezes
from the southward on sail in light

Wednesday Dec 4th
Fine weather and light breezes
from the southward strong off to
the northward ends with light
and baffling winds with thick
rainy No Obs

Thursday Dec 5th
Commenced light breezes from S
cleared up fine heading to the S
saw one sail ends strong breezes
from S.W 2 sail in light

Friday Dec 6th
Commenced with a fresh Gale
and thick rainy weather from
N.W at 10 Close reefed 10th
sails Middle heavy Gale from S
headed here 1st sail ends strong
Gale with clear weather Close
reefed main 1st sail and storm
stay sails Lat 46.02 S
Long 80.08 W

Put a man in

24 hours confinement

Saturday Dec 7th 1878
Commenced with a fresh Gale at moderate
set double reefed 10th and 11th sails
S clear Nothing in sight Ends with
strong breezes and thick hazy weather
from S heading to the Westward

Sunday Dec 8th
Commenced with strong breezes and
thick hazy weather from S.W
all sail to the Westward Nothing
in sight Ends with strong breezes
and thick hazy foggy weather from
S.W heading to N.W all sail
Nothing in sight No Obs

Monday Dec 9th
Commenced with strong breezes
and hazy from S.W by the wind
to the Westward all sail Middle
the same ends moderate with
thick and hazy heading to S.W

Tuesday Dec 10th
Commenced with moderate
breezes from S.W with thick weather
by the wind S.E all sail ends with
light breezes and fine weather saw a
right Whale lowerd 4 boats without
success

Wednesday Dec 11th
Light and sun S Nothing in sight
ends calm saw 2 Right Whales
lowerd 4 boats started twice no
chance Lat 44.15 S
Long 83.40 W
