

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of New

Thursday Dec 12th 1874
Commenced Calm and foggy ends
light. Breeze from S.W. Saw 2 Whales
When they nearly all day started
twice could not get past any ship

Friday Dec 13th
Commenced with light and fresh
breeze from S.W. Opposite Jacks
Under the same Lat. 44.18 S
Long 84.03 W

Saturday Dec 14th
Fine weather from the Southward
at 4 saw a Whale toward 8 boats
took him to the ship at 8 and
ryper from S.W. Cutt the Whale
had cutting Lat. 44.20 S
Long 84.09 W

Sunday Dec 15th
Commenced strong breeze and
and ryeper from S.W. cleared up
and started the works. Middle
thick ends fine weather. Employed
boiling

Monday Dec 16th
Commenced with light Breeze
from S. heavy swell from S.W.
Under the same No Obs

Tuesday Dec 17th
Calm but a heavy swell from
S.W. Employed Boiling. Middle light
and ends with thick hazy weather
from N.W. finished Boiling
Lat 44.24 S Long 82.50 W

Wednesday Dec 18th 1874
Commenced with fresh breeze and
thick rainy weather from N.W.
Opposite Jacks by the water that sail
Under with strong breeze and squally
from N.W. Employed stowing down

Thursday Dec 19th
Commenced with strong breeze
with heavy rain squalls shifting
to S.W. finished stowing down at
4 a strong gale took in from 3 to 5
sail. Middle moderating. Set 3 or 4
sail. Under strong breeze
from S.W. all sail nothing in light
Lat. 44.10 S
Long 83.08 W

Friday Dec 20th
Commenced with strong breeze and
squally from S.W. by the water N.W.
all sail Under with strong breeze
and thick weather

Saturday Dec 21st
Commenced with thick bad weather
from S.W. nothing in light. Ends
with fine weather

Sunday Dec 22nd
Commenced with fine weather
and light breeze from N. Opposite
Jacks all sail nothing in light
Under with fine weather from N.W. 9 or
heating to S.W. saw 3 or 4 backs
Lat 44.39 S
Long 84.56 W
