Wednesday Jan 1st 1879
Commenced with light Breezes
with thick heavy weather from the
Westward Ends with a thick fog
No Obs

Thursday Jan 2nd
Commenced with light Breezes
and thick fog from S.W. West
side by the wind Oposite sails
middle and rather thick fog and
rainy

Friday Jan 3rd
Commenced with Moderate
Breezes from the Eastward Saw
2 Right Whales lower and
Spunk and killed them both
lost the large one with the
small one ends with fine
weather from the Eastward saw
Nothing Lat 45.30 S
Long 82.14 W

Saturday Jan 4th
Commenced with light Breezes
and fine weather from S.E. &
steering off to the Westward
ends the same

Sunday Jan 5th
Light airs and fine weather
from S.E. steering off W to
Boil the Whale to green cooled
down Ends the same fine
weather one sail in light
Lat 44.20 S
Long 84.58 W

Commenced with fine weather from
the Southward heading to the Westward
all sail 2 sails in light throughout
the 24 hours the same started the
works

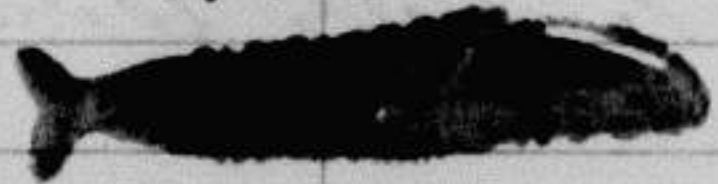
Tuesday Jan 7th
Commenced with fine weather and
light Breezes from S.W. and West
Employed Boiling Middle fine weather
Finished Boiling 22 bbls Ends with
Buggy weather from W steering off to
S.E. easy sail
Lat 44.13 S
Long 84.32 W

Wednesday Jan 8th
Commenced with Buggy and fine
rain from W and veering to S.W.
Coarse S.E. by E double reefed 3rd
sails Nothing in light Ends with
Heavy Breezes from S.W. Coarse
S.E. by E that sail

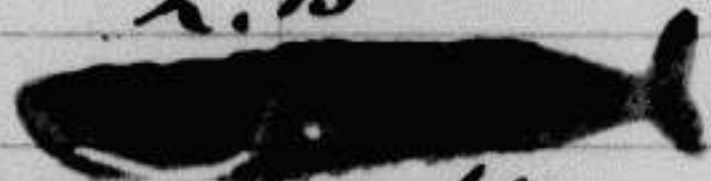
Thursday Jan 9th
Commenced with a fresh Gale from
S.W. of the wind to the S.E. Middle
Breeze Gale Ends with Heavy Breezes
and squalls from S.W. to W.S.W.
heading to the S.E. Lat 44.42 S
Long 81.42 W

Commenced with Moderate Breezes and
fine weather from W.S.W. Coarse S.E. &
all sail Ends with fresh Breezes
and veering to W Coarse S.E. &
all sail Employed Steaming down
