Saturday Jan 11th 1879
Commenced with strong breezes from
W to N.W. Commenced all sail except
Scraping Bone. Ends with fine weather
and light breezes from N.W. Employed
washing horse boards. No all sail

Sunday Jan 12th
Commenced with light breezes
and fine weather from N.W. Commenced
N.E. by E all sail nothing in light
Ends with light foggy weather
No Obs

Monday Jan 13th
Commenced with fresh breezes
from the Westward with foggy
squalls. Saw 4 ships all of
them Boiling Ends with strong
breezes and foggy.

Tuesday Jan 14th
Commenced with a Gale from
S.E. W. and clear. Saw 6 double
reefed. Main top sail and storm
stay sails. Ends with a strong
Gale with Main Squalls

Wednesday Jan 15th
Commenced with a strong Gale
and heavy sea from S.E. W. have
to Oposite Jacks. Ends with
strong breezes and thick hazy
weather from S.W. Short sail
3 sails in light

Long 74. 19 W

Thursday Jan 16th 1879
Commenced with fresh Gale and
thick hazy weather from W.S.W. Short
Sail Oposite Jacks 3 sails in light
Ends with W thick and hazy 4
sails in light

Friday Jan 17th
Commenced with strong breezes
and thick hazy weather from W
Sailed with the Milton and
Bounding Billow. Ends with a strong
Gale from W.S.W. with thick rainy
weather heading to S.W. No Obs

Saturday Jan 18th
Commenced with a fresh Gale
with thick foggy and rain from W
Middle moderating with foggy Ends
moderate and foggy No Obs

Sunday Jan 19th
Commenced with thick hazy weather
from W. Sailed with the John Perry
and Bounding Billow. Ends with
thick and foggy weather from W
No Obs

Monday Jan 20th
Commenced with light breezes and
thick foggy from W.S.W. and S.W. Saw
one sail. Middle thick foggy Ends
clear. Saw a Whaler towed 4 boats took
him. Saw the Lancer when the boats
was off
