Sacks or 400 lbs Flour. 2 Sacks of Beans

directed by our National Man of War
the Pensacola offering aid if needed

Strong Breezes and fine weather
from N.W. Employed Packing Flour
Stowing it and the Bread cleaned
out Between Decks all ready for
the balance of the Water

All these 24 hours fine weather and
fitting the lower Butting Blocks Stops
with various jobs all ready for Sea
but some more Water and Crew

Friday Mch 7th
Fine weather Employed fitting Butting

Fine weather Employed fitting the
Butting Block Straps

Sunday Mch 9th
Fine weather Remnant of the Starboard
Watch on Liberty

Strong Breezes and fine weather
took a boat load of Water

Block Straps 3 men out of the 10 left laid up

Wednesday Mch 12th
Fine weather fitting Butting Sear Capt
Fisher came off a little while for the first
time since he went on shore

Thursday Mch 13th
Strong Breezes and fine weather
Employed at small jobs around the
Ship

Friday Mch 14th
Shore 24 hours thick and foggy weather
from N to N.W.

Saturday Mch 15th
Strong Breezes from the Southward
Employed Stowing over the after Hatch
taking account of provisions 46 1/4 bbls
Salt Beef and 37 bbls Pork 98 1/4 all
total 500 Gallons Molasses 11 Casks Bread
57 bbls Flour

Sunday Mch 16th
Strong Breezes from the S the Port-
Watch on Shore

Monday Mch 17th
Strong Breezes and Foggy from the N
waiting Orders

Tuesday Mch 18th
Shore 24 hours light and mucky weather
took off a few small things from Shore
