

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Off New

Friday April 25th 1879
Commenced with fine weather from
S. Course. Wye & all fair. Anchors
and chains stowed. Watches and
Boats crews regulated. Middle light-
and bapling are on as calm the
Watches Employed at various jobs

Saturday April 26th
Commenced with light breezes
from N.W. to N.E.W. heading to S.E.
tonas with strong breeze and thick
hazy weather. No obs

Sunday April 27th
Commenced with strong breezes
and thick rain from S.E. Strong off
to the N.W. double reef up sails.
Ones with strong breezes at 10 p.m.
Saw the Island of Juan Fernandez
bearing W by S 1/2 S 1/2 off point

Monday April 28th
Commenced with fresh breezes
and hazy weather from S.E. at
5 a.m. got down close to the Island
hallooed off. These ones with strong
breezes Capt Fisher went on them to
get wood to sugar to get it off
got on board at Meridian

Tuesday April 29th
Strong breezes from S.E. to sugar to do
do anything. Ones the same off and
and 4 ships in company

Wednesday April 30th 1879
Commenced with fresh. Sails and fine
weather off and on hard work to holders
Ones with thick sugar & boats in fishing

Thursday May 1st 1879
Commenced with bad sugar weather
from S.E. ones on to sugar to get off
wood. Middle wine hallooed to the S and
clue to a calm. Ones with light ones
and calm. Lander 15 miles off bearing
S

Friday May 2nd
Commenced with light ones and
calms. Lander with the Lancer and
Materia. Lander Middle and Lander light
ones and calms working in for the
land

Saturday May 3rd
Light ones from S.E. got into the
land went on shore with 3 boats
got off 5 loads of wood and stored
it away. Ones with light and bapling
are getting off. Wood with 3 boats

Sunday May 4th
Commenced calm at 4 got off all the
wood. Stood to the Westward light-
breezes from S.W. Ends with fresh
and light breezes from the Southward
heading to the Westward all fair
Lat 32.53 S
Long 91.00 W
