

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of New

Monday May 5th 1879
Commenced with light breeze and fine weather from S.E. by the wind to S.W. all sail Tones with light breeze and fine weather from S.E. by the wind to S.W. all sail watches employed at various jobs

Tuesday May 6th
Light breeze and fine weather from S.E. hauling to S.W. Tones calm and clear No Obs

Wednesday May 7th
Commenced calm watches employed at various jobs Tones calm and clear Massesman in light to S.E. weather employed at various jobs repairing the Bow Boat

Thursday May 8th
Commenced with light breeze from the N.W. Tones with light breeze from the Northward

Friday May 9th
Commenced with light Breeze from the N. at 2 fresh Breezes at 5 fresh Sails hauled the fore Top Sails at 7 clear reefed main Top Sails Tones with a fresh Sails with bad reefed from the Northward Tones to Massesman in light

Saturday May 10th 1879
Moderating down to a calm with a heavy swell running Tones with fresh Breezes from the Westward by the wind Opposite Tacks the Hancer off to the Eastward

Sunday May 11th
Commenced with fresh Breeze and squally from the Westward by the wind Opposite Tacks Tones with fresh Breezes and fine weather from the Southward by the wind Opposite Tacks saw 2 sails Massesman in light

Monday May 12th
Commenced with fresh Breezes and fine weather from S.E. Tones with fine weather from S.E. by the wind Opposite Tacks one ship and the Hancer to the S dist 30 miles

Tuesday May 13th
Fine weather Tamed with the Hancer employed repairing the 2 Boat getting her ready to Point Tones fine from the Eastward Hauling and repairing the S.B. the Hancer dist about 80 miles

Wednesday May 14th
Fine weather from the Eastward the Hancer and Hauler in light Middle with light S.E. Tones & Breeze W all Sails one sail in light
