N Short Sail at 4 moderating some
thick hazy weather from N.W. W saw
the hauled in Lines strong Breezes
and hazy from N.W. by the winter
Oposite Jacks all sail

Sunday May 18th
Commences with strong Breezes
from N.W. by the winter to N.E. S
middle strong Breezes Ends with a fresh
Sail from N.W.

Monday May 19th
Commences with a fresh Gale
and thick hazy weather from N.W.
making to N.W. S Short Sail Ends
with a strong Gale veering to W
thick and rainy
