

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of New

Thursday Aug 7th 1879
Commences with light Trades and
thick Hazy weather Saw Hump & Fin
backs Blackfish and Transfuses Ends with
light airs and Hazy Lat 7.44 S
Long 81.34 W

Friday Aug 8th
Commences with light airs and
Hazy weather from S.E. Coast of and
N.W. Tends hazy at midnight
got close in to the Lobos hauled off
N.W. Commences a long way out
Lat 6.53 S
Long 82.16 W

Saturday Aug 9th
Commences Calms and light
airs Coarse from E.N.W. to N.W.
Tends with light airs and Calms
Lat 5.40 S
Obs a long way out Long 81 10 W

Sunday Aug 10th
Commences with light airs and
Calms Steady off N.W. and E.N.W.
for Payta Tends with strong southerly
winds laying off Payta Head

Monday Aug 11th
Strong Breeze from the Southward
off and on at daylight Kept off
for Payta got in shore at midday

This day I H. B. Chase
have turned the Lancer over
to Capt Lewis and out by
the Lancer to take charge of
her

Tuesday Aug 12th 1879
Fine weather Capt Lewis the New Master
came off at 1. pm. Nearly all of the crew
refused all the cruicors to sail under him
wanted to see the Capt of the Port went
on shore got them off still refused putt
to in Irons and Chained them down the
Main Hatch they have no fault to find
only Capt Fisher did not tell them when
he was going when he left the ship
and they would not sail under any
man at dusk Capt Lewis and the Capt
of the Port went on shore Ends fine
fine weather off and on

Wednesday Aug 13th
Commences fine at 5 pm Capt
Lewis came off with his things bound
forward and stood to sea at 7th
men in Irons 9 of them wanted to
go to duty let them out under by
Tends with light Trades and Cloudy
heading S.W. No Obs

Thursday Aug 14th
Commences with light Trades and
Cloudy weather Throughout the same
Lat 6.15 S
Long 83.37 W

Friday Aug 15th
Fine weather and light Trades
heading S.W. all sail Ends light
Trades and fine weather Employed
open 2nd sail
