

Remarks On Board Bark Fairer Of

Tuesday Sept 16th 1879
Commences with light and
baffling winds at 4 Sam the
Hull of Juan Hernandez passing
N.E. by E. heading for it got some
water casks ready to go on shore
ends with light airs from S.E.
working down for the Island at Meridian
about 15 miles off.

Wednesday Sept 17th
Commences with light-airs from
the Southward at 6 got down to
English or Selkirk's Bay calm
with some light Puffs off the
land a boat come off much pot
bores ends light and baffling
took the raft ashore for water

Thursday Sept 18th
Light baffling airs and calms
got the raft off and stowed a
part of it heading off to the E
middle light Bores from West
heading to S.E. ends with strong
bores from S heading to the
Eastward finished stowing water
Lat 34 01 S

Friday Sept 19th
Strong bores from S.E. to
S.E. by the wind to the Eastward
all sail Middle Squally Short-
sail ends with strong bores
from S.E. by the wind to the E
Lat 34 12 S
Long 75 47 W

New Bedford Capt. Albert Lewis Master

Saturday Sept 20th 1879
Strong bores from S.E. to S by the
wind to the E whole of sails and courses
set ends the same
Lat 34 25 S

Sunday Sept 21st
Strong bores from S by the wind
to S.E. till 6 pm veered ship to
N.W. ends with strong bores
from the S by the wind to the S.E.
Lat 34 51 S
Long 73 34 W

Monday Sept 22nd
Strong bores from S by the wind
Opposite Jacks through hour then 24
hours the same
Lat 34 59 S

Tuesday Sept 23rd
Commences with strong bores
from S to S.W. by the wind Opposite
Jacks ends winds the same with
thick and foggy weather
Lat 35 39 S
Long 73 27 W

Wednesday Sept 24th
Commences with thick foggy weather
from S by the wind Opposite Jacks
ends with fresh Sails from S.E.
by the wind to S.W. double reefed
top sails saw many rainbows
and one sail steaming to N.E.
Lat 35 17 S
