from S.S.E short sail to S.W
Ends the same clear fine weather

Friday Sept 26th
Strong Breezes from S.S.E heading
to the S.W double reefed Jap. Sails
jib & Spanker Ends with strong
breezes and fine weather from S
to S.S.E Jap. Sails Courses jib
and Spanker set

Saturday Sept 27th
Strong Breezes and fine weather
from S by the wind to the Eastward
Ends with a fresh Gale with heavy
weather from S to S.S.E

Sunday Sept 28th
Commences with strong breezes
from S.S.E to S.W double reefs
and storm stay sails Ends with
fresh breezes and thick hazy weather

Monday Sept 29th
Commences with fresh breezes and
hazy weather from S.S.E to the E with
Jap. sails set Ends with strong
breezes and thick weather from S
to S.S.E by the wind Oposite Tacks

S.S.E at 3 thick fog and fine rain
Ends Moderate and thick foggy
No Obs

Wednesday Oct 1st 1879
Commences with light breezes and
thick hazy weather from S.S.E
Ends with thick hazy weather
Lat 37.05 S

Thursday Oct 2nd
Commences with light airs and
foggy at 4 clear sun the breeze of
S.W breezes varying to dist about 80
miles Middle Calm Ends with light
breezes and thick hazy weather from
the North No Obs

Friday Oct 3rd
Commences with fresh breezes and
thick raining weather N.W. wind
to N.W. breeze S.S.W Ends the
same No Obs

Saturday Oct 4th
Commences with thick raining
weather from N.W. by the wind
Oposite Tacks Short Sail Ends
with fine weather from the Westward
all sail watches employed at various
jobs
