

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of

Sunday Oct 5th 1879
Commenced with light breezes
and fine weather from W Course
E all sail till sunset. Ends with
fine weather from N.W heading to the
Eastward all sail Lat 38-40 S

Monday Oct 6th
Commenced with fine weather from
N.W. Saw the Island of Noche having
N.E. by N Middle Calm Ends with
light Breezes from S.E. working in
for Noche got Anchors ready

Tuesday Oct 7th
Commenced with light baffling
aces got in at 4 from Anchored
in 10 fathoms 45 fathoms Scope
Port Anchor Middle light baffling
aces and raining Ends Calm and
cloudy took off 30 bbls of Potatoes and
some Wood 2 Men Deserted

Wednesday Oct 8th
Commenced Calm and light baffling
aces with rain finished getting off
6 Cords of Wood all ready to go to
Sea waiting for a Breeze Middle light
and baffling aces at 7 am took
the Anchor with a light Breeze
from N.W. Stead to Sea

Thursday Oct 9th 1879
Commenced with fresh Breezes from
N.W Breeze S.W Saw 2 sails Middle
Squally with rain Ends light baffling
aces Lat 39-27 S

Friday Oct 10th
Commenced with light aces and
clear weather from S.E. to S.W Ends
with strong Breezes and rough weather
from S.E. heading to S.W double reefs
and Courses Lat 40-13 S
Long 76-31 W

Saturday Oct 11th
Commenced with a fresh Breeze and
rough weather from S.E. by the wind to
S.W double reefs Ends with strong
Breezes and fine weather from S
Lat 40-45 S

Sunday Oct 12th
Commenced with strong Breeze from
S veered ship to S.E. Nothing in
Sight Ends with fresh Breezes from
the S close hauled to S.E. all sail
foggy weather

Monday Oct 13th
Commenced with light Breezes and
thick foggy weather from S by the
wind to S.E. all sail Middle fresh
Breezes from N.W Breeze S all sail
Ends from S.W by the wind
Lat 42-29 S
Long 76-26 W
