

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of

Wednesday Nov 12th 1879
Commenced with strong breezes
and rages from W. B. S. down
Whaling Ends with strong breezes
and rages from W. to W.S.W.
Lat 45.44 S

Thursday Nov 13th
Commenced with rages bad weather
from W.S.W. Sailed with the fumes
Allen saw the Hutton Middle Moderate
Ends with squally weather 2 Sails
in light Lat 45.26 S
Long 90.10 W

Friday Nov 14th
Commenced with strong breezes
saw the fumes Allen placing whale
saw 3 right whales going quick
no chance to lower ends with a
fresh sail lower 3 boats no light
squally lost run of him

Saturday Nov 15th
Commenced with a sail from
W. close reefed top sails saw 2
sail cones with a sail close
reefed main top sail and storm
stay sails saw a whale at 44.53 S
Long 79.32 W

Sunday Nov 16th
Commenced with strong sail and
squally from W.S.W. to W.W. ends
with strong breezes and heavy squalls
from W. Barometer very low for
heavy weather lost sail
Lat 45.23 S
Long 79.34 W

New Bedford Capt. Albert Lewis Master

Monday Nov 17th 1879
Commenced with strong breezes and
heavy squalls of rain and whale from
W. at 6 moderate saw a right whale
no chance to lower one sail in light
Barometer very low ends with heavy
whale and rain squalls saw one whale
lower 3 boats doubled sea and kept the
run of him working to windward
Lat 45.32 S

Tuesday Nov 18th
Commenced with squally weather from
N.E.W. and a very sea running the
off of a sail not far off could carry
no sail middle moderating ends with
light also saw and lower for a
right whale going quick no chance
Lat 45.59 S
Long 90.15 W

Wednesday Nov 19th
Commenced with light and fresh
breezes from W. to W.W. fine weather
ends fine boats down chasing whales
Lat 46.09 S
Long 90.31 W

Thursday Nov 20th
Fine weather from the N. 3 boats
down chasing whale at 5 struck
one got it to the ship at 9 ends
calm and a heavy swell but
the whale thick and rainy

Friday Nov 21st
Commenced with light and
breeze clear up got ready
to sail to sea fine fine
Campbell Boiling
