Tuesday Dec 23rd 1879
Commenced with strong breezes
and sugar thick rainy weather
from W at 4 cleared up some
at 7 clear nothing in sight
middle moderating breezes with fresh
breezes and thick foggy weather from
W and W.S.W took in the S.B for
repairs No Obs

Wednesday Dec 24th
Commenced with thick foggy
weather from the Westward sailed
with Jane Martin under moderate
from W.S.W heading to the S. E. and
repassing S.B with various jibes
Lat 46° 27' S
Long 82° 54' W

Thursday Dec 25th
Fine weather from W.S.W nothing
in sight - Seas light - air and
foggy

Friday Dec 26th
Commenced light - air and foggy
Seas light - breezes and thick foggy
from the W

Saturday Dec 27th
A man named
Camiller Died
of Consumption
this morning at
about 9 o'clock
been laid up since
Jan 2nd 1879
Commenced with foggy and light-
air from heading to the Westward
middle the same under with foggy and
clear spells nothing in sight

Sunday Dec 28th 1879
Buried the man
at 4 o'clock to
day
Commenced fresh and light breezes
with foggy squalls from W.S.W Seas with
thick fog No Obs

Monday Dec 29th
Commenced thick foggy Seas thick
foggy and rain No Obs

Tuesday Dec 30th
Commenced with thick foggy and rain
Seas with hazy weather with fine rain
Lat 44° 40' S

Wednesday Dec 31st
Commenced with fine weather and
fresh breezes from S.W Nothing in sight
Seas with thick rain from W to
W.S.W Short Sail No Obs

Thursday January 1st 1880
Commenced with thick rain
from W.S.W Short Sail Seas with
fresh breezes and squally from the
Westward Steaming off to S.E. Easy sail
Lat 45° 25' S
Long 83° 12' W

Friday Jan 2nd
Strong Breezes and sugar from
W Short Sail to S.E. and E
Seas with strong breezes from W
Steaming off. E.S.E. Short Sail
Lat 45° 40' S
