bores and thick squally weather
from W.S.W. 4 sails in sight

Commenced with fresh Gale
and thick rainy S.W. with the
James Allen Tends with fresh
Gales and thick rainy weather
Short Sail 5 sails in sight
Lat 43. 48 S

Thursday Jan 15th
Strong Bores and heavy squalls
from W.S.W. Oposite Jacks by
the wind ends with strong Gales
and thick squally from W.S.W.

Friday Jan 16th
Commenced with a strong Gale
with rain squalls from W.S.W. and
W. ends with a strong Gale and
thick rainy from W.

Saturday Jan 17th
Commenced with a fresh Gale
and thick rain from N.W.
and bearing back to W. in
sight. Ends with fresh Bores and
fine weather S.W. 6 sails in sight
Lat 43. 19 S
making a 21 S. S. Must

Sunday Jan 18th 1880
Commenced with fresh and light
bores with heavy squalls from the S. to
S.W. spoke the James Allen Tends with
fine weather from S.W. heading to S.E. for
the Lancer saw the Blower of Hauls at
10 sailing E by N
Lat 43. 45 S
Long 75. 36 W

Monday Jan 19th
Commenced with fine weather from
W.S.W. the Blower bearing E by N dist-
15 miles 2 sails in sight. Saw Humphrey
Tends with fine weather from W.
Lat 44. 40 S

Tuesday Jan 20th
Commenced with light bores
and heavy from N.W. saw
with the Safford and Boarding Billow
saw 4 ships Middle thick. Ends fine
Hauls in sight. Saw 10 sails
Lat 43. 37 S

Wednesday Jan 21st
Commenced with fine weather
from S.W. steering off Course and
by the wind Oposite Jacks Crustace
making a main set in Coops tone
ends fine weather 10 ships in sight

Thursday Jan 22nd
Commenced with fine weather from
W.S.W. saw many Hauls back Lancer
in sight to the S. ends with fine
weather. Sailed with the J. A.
Howland Mary & Susan and Humboldt
