W.S.W. Oposite Jacks shed sail
5 Sails in sight

Commenced with a strong Sails
and squally from W.S.W. and S.S.W.
heading to the Westward Close under 3rd

double reefed 3rd Sails

Wednesday Jan 28th
Commenced with moderate Breeze
and thick Cloudy from SW Breeze
N till 7 half of the wind to the
Westward Short-Sail Ends with
Strong Breeze thick and rainy

Commenced with moderate and
breeze and light rain squalls from
S.S.W. Ends with light air and fine
weather from W.S.W. Employed making
a new 5th Boom

Lat 39.51 S

Friday Jan 30th
Commenced light air and calm
except in the 5th Boom Ends with
light Breeze and squally from W.S.W.

Lat 38.48 S

Long 76.13 W

Saturday Jan 31st
Commenced with light Breeze and
squally squalls from W.S.W. of the land NW
Employed on the boom Ends fine
weather from S. at Mission Lane
a sperm Whale got all ready to
lower
