Sunday Feb 1<sup>st</sup> 1880  
Fine weather from the S Wharf in  
Sight at 1 lowered 3 Boats this  
chance went out of Sight in 2  
risings Tides with fresh breezes  
and fine weather from S.S.E  
by the wind to the Eastward  
Lat 37.29 S

Monday Feb 2<sup>nd</sup>  
Commenced with strong breezes  
and fine weather from S to the  
Eastward double reefed 3rd Sails  
nothing in Sight Tides with  
fine weather from S to the W  
Employed on the fishery  
Lat 37.24 S  
Long 76.08 W

Tuesday Feb 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Commenced with weather from  
S.W. Steady off N.W. Easy  
Sail nothing in Sight Tides  
fine weather

Wednesday Feb 4<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with fine weather  
from W nothing in Sight Tides  
with Hazy weather from the Northward

Thursday Feb 5<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with Hazy weather  
from the Northward at 6 had a  
sudden shift to the S with rain  
Tides light air and calm  
Employed cleaning Bone  
Lat 36.52 S  
Long

# New Bedford Capt Albert Lewis Master

Friday Feb 6<sup>th</sup> 1880  
Commenced light air and calm  
to work on the Bone Saw framing  
Blackfish at sunset lowered the Bone  
Tides fresh breezes and fine weather  
finished Scraping the Bone  
Lat 36.55 S

Saturday Feb 7<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with strong breezes  
and fine weather from N.W. to  
S.W. by the wind Tides with  
light air and calm Employed on  
washing Bone and boiling out the  
Blackfish  
Lat 36.55 S  
Long 74.46 W

Sunday Feb 8<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced light air and calm  
nothing in Sight Tides light air  
and calm Lat 36.32 S

Monday Feb 9<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with light breezes  
from S.S.W. down N.W. at sail  
Tides fine weather from S.S.W. Employed  
washing Bone Lat 35.21 S

Tuesday Feb 10<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced fine weather from  
S.S.W. finished washing Bone  
Tides with strong breezes from S.S.E  
heaving to S.W. Heel sail  
Lat 34.32 S
