breezes and fine weather. Shot sail

Thursday Feb 12th
Commenced with Strong Breezes
and fine weather from S.S.E.
Oposite Jacks by the wind ends
the same raged double reefed
and Spanker to the Eastward
Lat 35.02 S
Long 76.46 W

Friday Feb 13th
Commenced with Strong Breezes
and fine weather from S heading
to the Eastward. Nothing in sight
under with strong breezes and fine
weather from S heading S.S.E.

Saturday Feb 14th
Commenced with Strong Breezes
from S.S.W heading to S.E. under
with a fresh Gale from S.S.E.
Lat 35.31 S
Long 75.03

Sunday Feb 15th
Commenced with a fresh
Gale from S.S.E. Shot sail on
Oposite Jacks. Under strong Gale
from S. Close reef top sails and
Storm Stg Sails Saw 2 Sails

Monday Feb 16th 1880
Commenced with a strong Gale
from S. heading to under with a Gale
thick and hazy from S.S.E.

Tuesday Feb 17th
Commenced with a fresh Gale
from S.S.E. Close reef top sails
and Storm Stg Sails. Under moderate
Lat 35.28 S

Wednesday Feb 18th
Commenced with Breezes from
S.S.E. heading to the East all sail
under calm employed sending up
the fore top 3 mast

Thursday Feb 19th
Commenced fine weather from
W. very light and employed on
the mast and rigging under with
fresh and light breezes from N.W.
Steering off S.E. employed fitting
blocks receiving off rigging crossing
fore top 3 mast with various jobs
Lat 36.28 S
Long 76.43 W

Friday Feb 20th
Commenced with fresh Breezes
and fine weather from N.W.
Commenced S.E. employed on the rigging
under with fine weather employed
on the rigging and drying the Board
Lat 36.27 S
