Commences with a Gale from S

Ends fine weather from S Lat 31.
Sails down fifth & spanker
Lat 31.27 S

Monday June 14th
Commences fine weather from
S by the wind to the Eastward all
light ends calm complies
Painting Boat and repairing fore
top sail

Tuesday June 15th
Commences calm finished
and bent over top sail ends
with fine weather and light
breezes from the Westward Course
S. S. E. all sail bent a new spanker
Lat 31.48 S
Long 82.56 W

Wednesday June 16th
Commences fine weather from W
Course S. S. E. Ends fine weather ends
at various jobs Shipped 3 Boats

Thursday June 17th 1880
Commences with strong breezes
and rages from N. W. Sailed with
Jane Martin Hunter plus Jacob H
Howland Ends the same double
reefs opposite Jacks

Friday June 18th
Strong breezes and hazy weather
from N. E. W. heading to the Westward
Ends with a strong Gale and strong
No Obs

Saturday June 19th
Strong Gale and thick raining
from N. E. W. have to short sail
Ends thick and raining

Sunday June 20th
Commences thick and squally from
N. S. W. at 3 clear off fine weather
Middle light rain squalls Ends fine
from the Westward Lat 32.09 S

Monday June 21st
Commences with fine weather
from W to N. E. W. Middle and latter
strong breezes from N. W. Lat 31.55 S
Long 91.01 W

Tuesday June 22nd
Commences with strong breezes and
thick hazy squally weather from N. W. W.
Short sail Ends with strong breezes
and hazy weather from N. E. W.
heading to the Southward Short sail
Lat 32.29 S
