

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of

Tuesday July 20th 1880

Commenced with thick squally weather from the East. Boiling in light. Ends fine. Saw Sperm Whales at 9 am. Lower 3 Boats at 9. Shuck got one Boat badly stove

Wednesday July 21st

Strong Bores from E. got the Wh. to the ship at 4 o'clock got ready for cutting. Rugged ends with light wind but rugged back cutting

Thursday July 22nd

Commenced with a shift of wind from N. to W. with heavy rain. got the Head off and Boiled in. Ends fine weather from N. W. took in the Head cleaned up Stacks the Works

Friday July 23rd

Fine weather from N. W. cutting up junk and Boiling ends fine. Lat 33.39 S

Saturday July 24th

Commenced fine weather from W. N. W. Boiling at 9 had a heavy Thunder storm from S. to S. E. and veering back to S. had to cool down. Ends with fine weather finished Boiling and stowed down the Head

New Bedford Capt Albert Lewis Master

Sunday July 25th 1880

Commenced with strong Bores and squally weather from S. W. to S. W. heading to the Westward. Ends fine from S. E. Boiling. Stowing down Oil. Lat 32.15 S Long 73.30 W

Monday July 26th

Fine weather from S. heading to the West. Stowing down Easy Sail. Saw one Sail. Ends with fine weather from S. W. took in the Stoven Boat for repairs

Tuesday July 27th

Fine weather with fresh Bores from S. W. to W. and W. N. W. Sailed with Jacob A. Howland. Ends fine. Boiled on the Boat with dinner. Jobs. Lat 32.21 S Long 72.30 W

Wednesday July 28th

Commenced with fresh Bores and fine weather. Sailed with the James Allen. Middle squally with rain. Ends with a strong Bore clear and fine

Thursday July 29th

Commenced with a Bore from W. S. W. and veering to S. S. W. Ends with strong Bores and thick haze from W. N. W. Boiled on the Boat. Saw one Sail. No Bore
