Friday Sept 10th 1890
Commenced with squally light S.W. shift of wind the boat a shore to get Wood could not get away today. One fine weather off and baffling winds 3 Boats after Nova got off. 3 Boat loads

Saturday Sept 11th
Strong Breeze and squally got off off 3 Boat loads of Nova got 3 light then off to S.W. Wind S.W. ends with strong Breeze and fine weather from S.W. the blunder in light

Sunday Sept 12th
Commenced with strong Breeze from S.W. by the wind opposite Jacks double reefed top sails. One the same
Lat 34.02 S
Long 77.30 W

Monday Sept 13th
Commenced with a fresh Gale and heavy squalls from S. Short sail to the Eastward. One with a Gale from S.W. Close reefed top sails
Lat 33.44 S

Tuesday Sept 14th
Commenced with a Gale from S.W. Middle moderating. One with a strong Breeze with heavy squalls

Wednesday Sept 15th 1890
Commenced with strong Breeze and squally weather from S.W. by the wind to the Eastward. Strong Breeze then 24 hours the same opposite Jacks by the wind

Thursday Sept 16th
Commenced with strong Breeze from S.W. Middle and latter the same
Lat 34.18 S

Friday Sept 17th
Commenced with strong Breeze and squally weather from S.W. One the same Breeze from main top sail Boats

Saturday Sept 18th
Commenced with strong Breeze from S. to the Eastward. One light all sail to the Eastward. One from more top sail Boats

Sunday Sept 19th
Commenced light breeze from S.W. S.W. One light breeze and fine weather
Lat 35.20 S
Long 75.09 W

Monday Sept 20th
Commenced with light breeze from S.W. to S.E. by the wind all sail. One with fine weather from S. to S.W. heavy from S. to S.E. by the wind all sail
