

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Off

Friday Oct 1st 1890
Commenced with strong breezes
and Bogg squalls from S.E. at 7
tacked ship to S.W. finished and
stowed the Port Cable and the
same Compline cleaning the Starboard
Cable
Lat 39.40 S
Long 77.03 W

Saturday Oct 2nd
Commenced with strong breezes
from S.E. by the wind to the Westward
and with fine weather from S.E.
by the wind to S.W. all sail finished
the Starboard Cable and stowed it
Lat 39.03 S

Sunday Oct 3rd
Commenced with light breezes
and fine weather from S.E. by
the wind all sail to S.W.
Middle light and variable winds
and fine with light breezes from
S.W. Course S.E. by S all sail
Lat 39.26 S
Long 79.13 W

Monday Oct 4th
Commenced with light breezes
from S.W. Course S.E. by S all sail
and with a Sall from S.E.

Tuesday Oct 5th
Commenced with a fresh Sall
and clear weather from S.E.
Through these 24 hours the same
Lat 41.00 S
Long 79.27 W

Wednesday Oct 6th 1890
Commenced with strong breezes from
S.E. with clear weather heading to the
S. double reefed 3rd sails and with
fine weather from S.E. sent down the
Main 3rd Sail Bared to fish being
sprung in the Stings
Lat 41.50 S
Long 80.24 W

Thursday Oct 7th
Commenced with light breezes
and fine weather from S.E. by
the wind to the S. Compline on the
Main 3rd Sail Bared and fine
finished the Bared
Lat 42.18 S

Friday Oct 8th
Commenced with light breezes
from S. to N.E. Course S.E. by S
the Main 3rd Sail Bared bent the
Sail wires at N.E. all sail Course
S.E. by S and with fresh breezes and
hazy from N.W. Course S. took
down the Main 3rd Sall Bared to
fish being rotten in the Stings
Lat 43.13 S
Long 77.17 W

Saturday Oct 9th
Commenced with fresh breezes
and hazy from N.W. Course S.E. by S
Compline fishing Main 3rd Sall
Bared and with thick and sailing
from N.W.
Lat 43.42 S
