

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Oct

Sunday Oct 10th 1880
Commenced with hazy weather
from WNW ~~at~~ Seca at Sun
set bar a V. 8. Tides with fish bones
and Hoop. Spralls from W to WSW Saw
right whales in evening got ready to
lower. Saw them no more. Saw many
Hump and Finbacks Seca from
7 to 15 miles off

Lat 44.35 S

Monday Oct 11th
Commenced with squally weather
from W to WSW. Oposi. Jacks off
Shore at dusk Seca bar S. 8.
from 10 to 12 miles off. Tides with
Strong Bores and squally from
W. Complied fishing the main Ids
S. Taper and repairing the Sail

Tuesday Oct 12th
Strong Bores and squally with
rain from WNW just at night
Saw right Whales by chamber
Tides thick and rainy weather
from WNW Shot sail to S.W

Wednesday Oct 13th
Commenced with strong bores
and thick rainy weather from
WNW and shifting to SE. Ends
with strong bores and Hazy from
S.W to SSW. Same with J. A.
Howland

Thursday Oct 14th 1880
Commenced with fine weather from
S.W the Island in sight. Saw 2 sails
and the same steering different courses
in there and to the S.E. along the Lancer
Saw Humpbacks

Friday Oct 15th
Commenced with fine weather from
S.W. Saw Humpbacks 2 sails in sight
Ends with fine weather from WNW
Complied at various jobs. Saw 2 sails
Lat 44.31 S
Long 75.53 W

Saturday Oct 16th
Commenced with light bores from
WNW to S.W by the wind all sail
Ends thick and hazy. No Obs

Sunday Oct 17th
Commenced thick foggy weather
with fine rain from WNW
Tides thick and Hazy weather
from WNW. Same with the fumes
Other No Obs

Monday Oct 18th
Commenced thick and raining
Saw one right Whales lower in
company with the fume Allen took
Sight of the Whales in the rain
Ends with strong bores and fine
weather from S.W by the wind to the
WNW. Saw many Finbacks and
one sail
