

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer - Op

Thursday Oct 29th 1880
Commenced with light Bouses
from W.N.W. Saw many Pinkbacks
and one Seal. Tides calm. Painted
Bow. Sprit & Mastboom Lat 47° 06' S

Friday Oct 29th
Commenced calm at 4 light
Bouses and fine weather from S.W.
Tides with fresh Bouses and heavy
weather from S.W. Course N.W. Easy
Sail Lat 46° 33' S
Long 78° 29' W

Saturday Oct 30th
Commenced with thick heavy
weather with foggy squalls from
S.W. Course N.W. till 7 Tides
with heavy weather clearing off to
the Northwest

Sunday Oct 31st
Commenced with fine weather
from W.S.W. Saw 3 seals. Sailed with
Nautilus & J.A. Howland Tides with
a fresh Gale and thick weather from
W.S.W. No Obs

Monday Nov 1st 1880
Commenced with a fresh Gale
from S.W. with thick weather. Tides
with heavy weather. Nothing in
Sight Lat 46° 01' S
Long 77° 02' W

Tuesday Nov 2nd 1880
Commenced with fresh Bouses and
heavy weather from S.W. Course N.E.
and N.E. double reefed. Top Sails saw
one Seal. Tides with fresh Bouses
and heavy from S.W. 2 Sails in
Sight No Obs

Wednesday Nov 3rd
Commenced with light Bouses
and cloudy from S.W. Tides thick
and foggy weather from W.N.W. Nothing
in Sight

Thursday Nov 4th
Thick and foggy weather from N.W.
Tides with a fresh Gale and thick
rainy weather from W.N.W.

Friday Nov 5th
Commenced moderate from W.N.W.
with thick foggy and fine rain
Tides the same from N.W.W.

Saturday Nov 6th
Commenced with heavy Bouses
at 7 a strong Gale with heavy
rain from N.W.W. Course Ship to
the N.E. double reefed. Top Sails. Middle
wind shifted to S.W. took in fore Top
Sail Tides with heavy squalls of
rain and Gale heading to N.W.
Gale reefed. Main Top Sail and then
Stay Sails
