Sunday Nov 7th 1880
Commenced with a moderate Sall
attended with heavy Squalls from
S.W. to W Short Sail Ends more
moderate from W Set double reef
to S.S.W Lat 45.38 S
Long 76.52 W

Monday Nov 8th
Commenced with a fresh Sall and
ragged from W Short Sail Opposite
tacks Ends with Strong Bous and
bad ragged weather from the Westward
Lat 45.41 S

Tuesday Nov 9th
Commenced with Strong Bous
and ragged from W by the wind to W.S.W. James Allen
in company Ends with a Strong
Sall and heavy Squalls from W
Lat 45.49 S
Long 77.35 W

Wednesday Nov 10th
Commenced with a fresh Sall
and bad sea from W.S.W. Close
reefed main top sail and storm
stay Salls Ends the same
Lat 45.38 S

Thursday Nov 11th
Commenced with a Sall and
heavy Squalls from W also seeing
to W.S.W. Ends with Strong Bous
and ragged saw 2 or 3 right Whales
lowered 3 boats without success
Lat 45.48 S
Long 77.10 W

Friday Nov 12th 1880
Commenced with light Bous from
S.W. With a bad sea running across with
Strong Bous and Squally from W.S.W.
to W.S.W. Nothing in sight
Lat 45.48 S
Long 77.13 W

Saturday Nov 13th
Commenced with Strong Bous and
ragged from W.S.W. to W.S.W. Ends
Strong Bous and Squally from
S.W. to W.S.W. double reefed top sails
Lat 45.19 S

Sunday Nov 14th
Commenced with Strong Bous
and fine weather Nothing in sight
Ends the same

Monday Nov 15th
Strong Bous from S.W. by the
wind to W.S.W. double reefed top
sails saw fairbacks Middle
wind veering to S fine weather
Ends the same Lat 45.39 S
Long 79.45 W

Tuesday Nov 16th
Commenced with fine weather from
S. heading to S.W. one sail in sight
Ends calm

Wednesday Nov 17th
Commenced calm Middle light Bous
and thick fog from W Course S.W.
Ends foggy till 11 broke a little
Lat 44.19 S
Long 79.34 W
