Tons thick from N. Nothing in sight

Monday Nov 22nd
Commenced with thick rain
from W Short fair Opposite Tacks
Tons with strong breezes from the
S Saw Seabacks

Wednesday Nov 24th
Fine weather from S.W. Nothing in sight
Tons with fine weather from W by the
wind to the Southward
Lat 45° 42' S
Long 82° 52' W

Thursday Nov 25th
Commenced with fine weather from
W at 2 left off & all sail
Tons foggy by shells same the f.a.
Hoon land

Friday Nov 26th
At these 24 hours fine weather and
fresh breeze from the Southward saw
2 Sails Lat 45° 45' S

Saturday Nov 27th
Fresh breeze and hazy weather
from N.W. one sail in sight
Tons foggy from N.W.

Sunday Nov 28th
Commenced with foggy weather from
N.W. by the wind to N.W. Tons with
strong breezes and hazy from
N.W. Saw Nothing but Seabacks
Lat 45° 35' S
Long 80° 18' W
