S.W

Commenced with Drash Breeze and
Hazy weather from S.W Ends fine
from W.S.W Breeze & all sail Nothing
in light

Wednesday Dec 1st 1880
Commenced with fine weather and
light Breeze from W.S.W Breeze & till
3 luffed by the wind to S Ends fine
weather from the Westward Saw Whales
3 Boats down Whales wilde

Thursday Dec 2nd
Fine weather from W at 5 Saw
Whales down took one got it to
Ship at 10 O'clock Ends with fresh
Breeze and Hazy weather Cutt the
Whale

Friday Dec 3rd
Fresh Breeze and Hazy from N.W
to N.W Breeze Boiling Saw one
sail Middle had a strong Gale
from the Westward hept to Coal down
Ends the same to back to Boil
Lat 45-39 S

Saturday Dec 4th 1880
Commenced with a strong Gale from
W with rain squalls Middle Moderating
Sturled the works Hept Boiling Breeze
Slow Ends the same

Sunday Dec 5th
Commenced with Moderate Gale and
a bad Sea from W.S.W Storm Boiling
Middle the same Ends with a Gale and
raining Sea to back clear

Monday Dec 6th
Commenced with a strong Gale
and thick fuming at 3 wind veering
to S.W cleared up and Moderating
Some started the works Middle fine
weather finished Boiling Ends with
from N.W Breeze S.W Storming
down Hazy No Ob

Tuesday Dec 7th
Thick and Hazy strong S Stroke
the Sapho Ends with a strong
Gale from S.W here to N.W
Lat 45-31 S

Wednesday Dec 8th
Commenced with a strong Gale from
S.W Middle Moderating Ends fine
weather finished Storming down Oil
and Breeze cleared up all ready to
Wash Ship
