 Commences with heavy squalls
 and baffling from N. to N. W.
 Middle thick and rainy. Clouds fair
 weather and strong breeze from the
 South. Saw nothing
 Lat 46.01 S
 Long 80.24 W

Saturday Dec 11th
Commenced with Strong Boreas.
and fine weather from 3.30 Saw
one sail and many Pinkbills
Tried Strong Boreas and fine weather
from the S double reefed Jip Sails
201-45-52 S

Saturday Dec 12th
Commences with Strong Breeze.
and raised from S.W. Saw 3 Sails
Ends with Strong Breeze and Heavy
from W.S.W Lat 46.40 S

Wednesday Dec 13th
Commenced with strong breezes at
a strong S.W. breeze upon the sails
and then S. sails were set.
Middle moderating. Breeze strong
breezes and heavy weather from
S.S.W.
Lat-45.45 S
Long 78.54 W

Commenced with fresh breeze and
breezy weather and a heavy sea from
S.S.W. heading to the Westward ~~obscure~~ ^{refused}
top. Sails under with strong breeze and
breezy weather from W.S.W. Nothing in
sight. No. 615

Wednesday Dec 15th
Commenced with strong Boreas and
raged with thick Hazy weather from
W.S.W. Saw 2 Right-Whales lowered one
Boat - No chance going to windward
quick ends with a strong Gale and
thick raining weather from W.S.W. when
to close reefed Main Top. Sail and
Ston Stg. Sails

Thursday Dec 16th
Commenced with a S. E. and heavy
to S. W. with thick Hazy weather
and with fresh S. E. and heavy
squalls from S. S. W. here to the N. W.
Lat 44. 50 S
Long 79. 37 W

Friday Dec 17th
Commenced with North Sals and
heavy squalls from S.W. near
11th to 1.30 at 4 nearer back
to W. Windy strong Bruses and
squally ends moderate and hazy
from S.W. Nothing in sight.
