Saturday Dec 18th 1880
Commenced with light air and
cloudy and fine rain from S.W.
Ends the same Lat 45.34 S

Sunday Dec 19th
Commenced with a fresh Gale
from S.W. cloudy and fine rain
to S.E. Middle light Bores and
Heavy weather from S.W. Ends with
Strong Bores Drizzle and fine rain
Lat 45.34 S
Long 79.34 W

Monday Dec 20th
Commenced with fine clear
weather with fresh Bores from N.W.
Saw one Sail Ends with a fresh
Gale with rain and foggy squalls
from W to N.W.
Lat 45.25 S
Long 80.42 W

Tuesday Dec 21st
Commenced with a fresh Gale and
end squally from N.W. by the
wind to N.W. double reefed Jib Sails
Ends the same Lat 46.20 S
Long 80.42 W

Wednesday Dec 22nd
Commenced with strong Bores
and fine weather from S.W. course S.W.
Ends with light Bores from S.W.
course S.E. Heavy and light foggy
Lat 45.25 S

Thursday Dec 23rd 1880
Commenced with ares from N.W.
Heavy weather course S.E. Nothing
in light - course with fresh Bores
and fine weather from N.W. course
S.E. Lat 45.14 S
Long 76.44 W

Friday Dec 24th
Commenced with strong Bores and
fine weather from N.W. course S.E.
by 6 at 7 passed ship to the Westward
ends thick foggy and rain

Saturday Dec 25th
Commenced with thick foggy
and fine rain nothing in light -
course with fresh Bores and
Heavy weather from N.W. course
S.E. all sail Lat 45.10 S
Long 75.14 W

Sunday Dec 26th
Commenced with fresh Bores
and Heavy from N.W. course from
S.E. by 6 at 7 all sail at
5 saw the Island of Sechart sailing
to elist 15 - about 15000 hides off
at 6 luffed by the wind to N.E. S
ends with strong Bores most part
fine weather from the Westward course
N.E. W saw many Whumpbacks
Lat 45.10 S
Long 74.45 W
