

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of

Sunday Jan 16th 1881
Commenced with strong breezes and
heavy fog from S.E. got the whale to the
ship and tried to butt Porter's ship
I ran out - had to give it up and then
the whale off there the land being no
more than 80-10 miles off. To
beheading off. 11 tons of blubber and
country porter's Strops 5 lbs

Monday Jan 17th
Commenced with light breezes
from S to S.W. got the whale off
and ~~body~~ in. Ends thick and
fine rain took in the ocean

Tuesday Jan 18th
Light breezes and fine weather
from S.E. cleared up and started
the works. Ends with fine weather
from S.E. Employed Boiling
Lat 42.52 S
Long 75.45 W

Wednesday Jan 19th
Strong breezes and fine weather from
S. Boiling. Ends with fine weather
from S. Sam 2 sails

Thursday Jan 20th
Fresh breezes and fine weather
from S. Employed Boiling. Saw the
Lusitania cutting a whale. Ends with
fine weather. Employed Boiling. Ends
fine Employed Stowing down

Friday Jan 21st 1881
Commenced with fine weather and fresh
breezes from S to S.E. Storm down. Oil
nothing in sight. Ends with fine weather
from S. finished Stowing down. Saw one
Sail to leeward
Lat 42.35 S
Long 76.19 W

Saturday Jan 22nd
Commenced with fresh breezes and
fine weather from S. Opposite Jacks by
the wind. Employed Stowing up. Ends
thick and heavy took in the storm
boat and fitted a new one

Sunday Jan 23rd
Commenced with heavy weather
from the S. by the wind. Opposite Jacks
drabble reefed. Top sails. Ends with
fine weather from S. Sam 1 pump
Thump backs
Lat 43.07 S
Long 74.38 W

Monday Jan 24th
Commenced with fresh breezes
and fine weather from S. Opposite
Jacks in sail in sight. Middle
light-ends. Ends calm

Tuesday Jan 25th
Light breezes and fine weather from
N.W. W. Sailed. The John P. W. made
thick and foggy. Ends fine from
N.W. W. Steaming. Employed Boiling
from S to S.E. Lat 43.30 S
Long 75.74 W
