

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Cp

Wednesday Jan 26th 1891
Commenced fine weather from N.W.
Saw the Island on sail in light
tides with light breezes and
fine weather from the Westward and
scraping Bone and black something
bluffs in sight.

Thursday Jan 27th
Commenced with fine weather
N.W. Sailed with the Mainmast
and J.P. West Tides with light
and calm breezes and fine
fine Top Sail the Island being to
N.E.

Friday Jan 28th
Commenced Calm & Sail in
sight the Island 15-20 miles off. Good
fine weather from the Westward
Saw a ship to windward whaling
barn at sail in chase finished
more Top Sail saw the Whales at
Meridian coming to leeward

Saturday Jan 29th
Strong breezes from B.B.
Sharp line Partia B.B. Struck
the same Whale & House after got
the Whale to the ship at 6 P.M. close
in then made sail to tow him off
Vine N.W. heading N.W. Middle
Moderate or strong breeze Calm and
raining Cutting Bae Strail tone
our Partia Strap Skin chain
Shackled fitted the best we
can got Head off and Bae day
in Vine to the S and rain

Sunday Jan 30th 1891
Commenced with strong breezes
and rain from the Eastward had
a heavy squall from S got the
Head in at dusk saw the land
barning white middle thick and rainy
Baled the case Tides with a strong
Sail from N.W. with heavy squalls
and rain Lat 42-44 S
Long 74-55 W

Monday Jan 31st
Commenced with a fresh sail
and sugar from S.W. at 2 Moderate
wind heading to S.W. started the
works and put up the gun 4 ends
with a fresh sail and sugar from
S.W. Bad Boiling frequent rain
squalls close up Top Sails

Tuesday Feb 1st 1891
Commenced with strong breezes from
S.W. saw a ship to the Eastward
Empire Boiling Tides with fine
weather from the S by the wind opposite
Jacks Boiling saw one sail
Lat 42-10 S
Long 75-17 W

Wednesday Feb 2nd
Commenced fine from S to S.W. and
Boiling finished at 4 P.M. saw one
sail Tides with heavy weather from
S.W. Empires strong down Oil in
the main Hatch No Ob
