

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of

Saturday Feb 19th 1881
Commenced with light breeze
and thick fog from S.W. finished
Boiling at 4 P.M. 100 lbs. Ends with
hazy weather and light breeze from
N.W. Employed Steaming down checked
the main watch and stowed the rest
in the after watch

Sunday Feb 20th
Commenced with thick fog from
N.W. Middle the same with
light airs and fine weather
Saw a Whale lower 3 boats going
quick

Monday Feb 21st
Calm chased the Whale out of
sight. No chance Ends with
light airs and Calms Windward and
Heavily in sight

Tuesday Feb 22nd
Light airs from S.E. Saw 3 Sails
Saw the Jacob A. Howland Middle
Calm End. Calm Saw a Whale
Lower 4 boats. Stuck Store the
L.B. all to pieces fast-repairing

Wednesday Feb 23rd
Light airs from N. took the Whale
to the ship at 1 O'clock got the boat off
and ballast in at 10. Ends with
thick hazy weather from the N.
Took in the Head and cover
the Windlass and covered the Palls

Thursday Feb 24th 1881
Commenced with thick raining
bad weather from the N. Employed
putting up funnels all ready to boil
Middle it cleared up started the Whales
Sails with light airs and light rain
squalls and fog
Lat 43-45 S
Long 75-40 W

Friday Feb 25th
Commenced with light airs and
and a heavy swell from S.E. Employed
Boiling Ends with fine weather from
S.E. Boiling
Lat 45-46 S

Saturday Feb 26th
Fine weather from S.E. Steaming
in to the S.E. Saw 2 Sails watches
temp. wind Boiling Middle wind S
Ends hazy and fine rain from N.
and veering to the Northward Boiling

Sunday Feb 27th
Commenced with thick raining
from N.W. at 7 Steady Breeze blew
repacked top Sails Ends with hazy
weather finished Boiling wind S and
veering to the Westward
Lat 45-39 S

Monday Feb 28th
Commenced with light breeze
and hazy from S.W. Steaming off N.W.
and N.W. Employed covering at 10
7 wind W Ends fine weather temp
Breaking out Sound 3 in and Steaming off
in the fore watch Steaming down
