Thursday March 3rd
Fine weather from N to S.W. let
the Lucretia have 10 Shooks saw
many Hump Backs 3 Shells in
sight - Hump in sight 25 miles
off S.E. ends with fine weather
from S.W. Landed with the Lucretia
Jacob H. Hovland and James Allen

Friday March 4th
Fine weather and light breeze from
S.W. to S.E. Landed the same boats
in sight - Hump from 10 to 20 miles
off

Saturday March 5th
Fine weather from S.W. Landed with
the James Allen and John P. West - Ends
with fresh Breeze and Hazy weather
from the Westward Observed Jacks 3 Shells
in sight - employed making Shooks

Hazy weather from N.W. to W. Ends with
fresh Breeze and Hazy weather from S.W.
heading to the Southward

W. Saw the John P. West - Whaling to the
ward kept off saw the Whales lower
3 Boats Whales going quick to windward
W.B. got a channel mist - lower twice
ends with a fresh Breeze heading to the W.
Shut sail saw 3 Ships

Tuesday March 8th
Fine weather from the S. near ship
to the Eastward nothing in sight -
ends with light Breeze and fine
weather saw Whales at daylight at
7 lower 3 Boats Whales going to the
Windward

Wednesday March 9th
Commenced Hazy got a Whale
a long way off toward ship to the
at 5 - Cutt with dark lights saw
from S.W. ends Breeze fresh Breeze
