

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Cp.

Thursday March 10th 1891
Commenced Balms and light airs
from N.W. W.S.W. finished Buttery and
cleared up all ready for Boiling &
Sails in Sight. Great Calm Boiling
the Island just in Sight and 2 Sails

Friday March 11th
Commenced Calm Boiling
Great light-airs and Calms 3 Sails
in Sight

Saturday March 12th
Commenced with light-airs from
S.E. and S. Boiling 3 Sails in Sight
and Haups Ends light-airs and
fine weather finished Boiling at
daylight about 8.5 AM

Sunday March 13th
Commenced light-airs and fine
weather 3 Sails in Sight. Sailed
with the John P. West Ends with
fresh Bakers and Mary from S.
Emp. Wier Stowing down Oil took
out the Second Tier Port Side in the
After Watch

Monday March 14th
Commenced with fresh Breezes and
veering to S.W. to the S.E. by the wind
Short sail finished Stowing down
Ends with fine weather and light
breezes from the Southern Emp. Wier at
various gobs clearing up the Island
in Sight. Many Haups backs

Tuesday March 15th 1891
Commenced with fine weather and light-
breezes from S.E. by the wind Opposite Sails
all Sail Sun 2 Sails and many Haups
backs Emp. Wier at various gobs Washing
Ship Ends with light-buffing airs
and Calms Saw many Haups backs

Wednesday March 16th
Commenced with light- Breezes and
fine weather from W and veering to
N.W. 3 Sails in Sight and many Haups
backs and Blackfish Emp. Wier at
various gobs Ends with fine weather
from N.W. to N.E. Sailed with the
Jas. Allen & J. A. Howland

Thursday March 17th
Commenced fine weather middle
thick and squally and fresh
Sail from S.W. Ends moderate
but a heavy sea running
Lat. 43.30 S
Long 76.00 W

Friday March 18th
Commenced with fine weather
from S.W. nothing in Sight
Ends with light-buffing airs. Saw
Whale 3 Boats down in chase
