

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Op

Saturday March 19th 1881
Commenced calm through the night and got him to the top at 9 o'clock at night. Middle calm once with a breeze spring up strong from at cutting back with the dead lark saw took the upper jaw at Mexican a Sale and thick from N.W.

Sunday March 20th
Commenced with a strong Sale cutting lost the keel and a chance with it. Saved the boiler at 3 o'clock ship to the Westward. Middle thick and heavy squalls of rain ends light and calm. Started the works.

Monday March 21st
Commenced calm through the night fine rain Boiling Middle the same ends fine but rarer from N to S.W. Steady off from N.W. to S.W. Boiling

Tuesday March 22nd
Commenced with fresh breeze and squall weather from S.W. Course at 8 o'clock Boiling at 5 o'clock at 7 o'clock sail luffed to cross thick and heavy. Employed Coopering the Oil to Store

Wednesday March 23rd 1881
Commenced with strong breeze veering from N.W. in squalls and rain. Ends with squally weather from W.S.W. Course N.W. double reefed. Employed a stowing down.

Thursday March 24th
Commenced with strong breeze and squally weather from W. by the wind to N.W. finished stowing down ends fine from W.S.W. Employed washing bone

Friday March 25th
Commenced with fine weather from W.S.W. Course at N.W. finished washing the bone ends hazy and fine rain washing. Davit and mast

Commenced with fine weather from S.W. Course at N.W. Employed washing ends the same Employed in the rigging and drying bone

Sunday March 27th
Commenced with fine weather from S.W. Course at N.W. to S.W. Ends with fine weather from the Southward. Course at S.W. Nothing in sight.
