Monday March 28th 1881
Commenced with strong breeze from S.E. to S.W. Commenced with a fresh Gale from S.E. to S.W. Short sail

Tuesday March 29th
Commenced with a fresh Gale from S.W. have to close reefed 3rd sails to S.W. Middle and latter the same close reefed main 3rd sail

Wednesday March 30th
Strong Gale from S.E. have to the S.W. close reefed main 3rd sail and storm stay sails. Commenced double reefed 3rd sails. Breeze ship to the Eastward. heavy no 3rd

Thursday March 31st
Moderate breeze from S. and S.W. light and heavy. Commenced fine weather. From S. and veering to the Westward employed a lot of small boats
Lat - 37.00 S
Long 76.12 W

Friday April 1st 1881
Commenced with heavy weather from S.W. and veering to W.N.W. Light breezes middle and thick. V.W. sail with rain and heavy squalls. Commenced with a Gale from N. and heavy rain. Close reefed main 3rd sail and storm stay sails

Saturday April 2nd 1881
Commenced with a thick rainy weather. Ship to the Eastward. Storm sails middle moderate but raining. Commenced fine from N.E. by the wind to the Eastward
Lat - 39.11 S
Long 75.41 W

Sunday April 3rd
Commenced with fresh and light breeze from N.W. at 6 began ship to N.W. Middle thick and heavy rain from the Eastward. Commenced fine weather. Wind N.W. by the wind to the North and all sail

Monday April 4th
Commenced fine weather from S.W. to W.N.W. Breeze N.E. at 7 thick and raining from W.N.W. Commenced with light breeze from S.W. Employed washing ship in side
Lat - 37.01 S
Long 74.18 W

Tuesday April 5th
Commenced light breeze and calm heading to the E. Commenced calm at daylight. Saw the land bearing E. Employed washing ship outside
Lat - 36.56 S
Long 73.43 W

Wednesday April 6th
Commenced calm at 7 light breeze from S.W. St. Marks bearing E. Middle fresh breeze at daylight. Light off E. in for the land. Commenced fine from S.W. to S. all sail got the anchors off the bow at anchor off the passage
