Friday June 10th 1891
The ship makes about 1200 strokes in 24 hours in rough water
Moderating down and fine rain
N.W. Course S.E. all sail middle strong
Breeze and squally from N.W. Course
S.E. under the same from N.W. fine rain
Main top S. sail and only fifth set
Lat 50.39 S
Long 79.03 W

Saturday June 11th
Commenced with strong breeze and
squally from W. Course S.E. at 2.58 S
at 4.58 by S.E. S. hauled top S. and
only fifth double reefed Main top sail
the wind veering a little to the Southward
middle thick weather from N.W. Course
S.E. S. S. under fresh sail and regular
heave

DR Long 78.10 W

Sunday June 12th

Pumps connected to
Commenced strong breeze from
N.W. Course S.E. S. at 2.58 S at
4.58 under N.W. Course with a fresh sail
from N.W. Course S.E. S. at 9 am S.E. S.
thick and raining No obs
DR Lat 55.50 S
DR Long 75.25 W

Monday June 13th
Commenced with a fresh sail and
thick squally from N.W. and veering to
W at 1 pm to course to sea running
Decks flooded most of the time
at head to heave to bear by sea
shore in the carryway board
close reefed Main top sail at
9.30 am moderating kept up to
double reefed Main top sail and
S.E. reefed fore and fore sail

Commenced with a fresh sail and thick
weather with a high sea from W. Course S.
double reefed Main top sail close reefed
middle fresh sail and thick from S to S.E. S.
at 7 am Course S.E. S. under thick with snow
and fine rain squalls at 9.30 Course N.E. S.E.
No obs

DR Long 67.59 W

Wednesday June 15th
Commenced with strong squalls from S to
S.E. Course S.E. Main top S. sail over high
top top sail from S to S.E. moderate squalls
lighter top snow and rain middle strong
sail and squally from S at 8 am saw
land bearing N.W. luffed up to off three
thick snow squalls and thick under the
same at 9.45 kept off to S.E. part a sail
Lat 56.40 S
Long 64.43 W

Thursday June 16th
Log line in gear
Log 2 hours
Commenced with strong breeze and squally
from S to S.E. at 8.30 S.E. S. thick snow
storm most of the time middle wind with
heavy squalls of snow and hail at 7 am Course
S.E. at N.E. S. S. whole top sail Main
top S. sail and only fifth wind S.E. much
snow and hail DR Lat 55.51 S
DR Long 61.14 W

Friday June 17th
Commenced with a fresh sail and squally
battering from S to S.E. hauled light sail and
reefed the top sails Course S.E. S. S. Course
thick moderate from S to S.E. W. Course from
N.W. and S.E. S. S. Main top S.
