

Remarks on Wednesday November 10th 1830

This day begins with Moderate breezes from N.N.E. and Cloudy weather steered to the Eastward - Middle & latter part wind from N.N.E. to N.E. & squally weather - steered to the S.E. -
So Ends this day Lat 35° 17' Long 62° 29' by Cr 60° 50' 61° 23'

Remarks Thursday November 11th 1830

This day begins with Quick breezes from the N.E. and squally weather steered to the S.E. Under single reefed topsails. Middle Much the same. Latter part pleasant weather wind at N.N.E. by from E.N.E. to East - Saw 6 sails to leeward -
So Ends this day Lat 34° 18' Long 60° 59' by Cr 61° 00' 60° 00'

Remarks on Friday November 12th 1830

This day begins with Quick breezes at N.E. and N.N.E. steered East with single reefed topsails. Middle part Moderate breezes - Latter part the same sent up top gallant yards and let all sail -
So Ends this day Lat 34° 18' Long 59° 18' Cron 59° 30'

Remarks on Saturday November 13th 1830

This day commences with light breezes from the N.N.E. and pleasant weather steered to the Eastward with all sail. Middle part Calm. Latter part brisk breezes at N.N.W. steered E.N.E. -
So Ends this day Lat 34° 43' Long 58° 04' Cronometer 5820

Remarks on Sunday November 14th 1830

This day begins with light breezes from the north and light squalls of rain steered to the Eastward. Middle and latter strong breezes and squally weather double reefed the topsails -
So ends the day Lat 34° 40' Long 56° 20' Cron 56° 00'

Remarks on M. November 15th 1830

This day begins with strong breezes from the North and very squally weather steered E.N.E. with double reefed topsails. Middle and latter part wind from South to N.E. and very squally with a tremendous swell from N.E. -
So Ends this day Lat 34° 40' Long 55° 00'

Remarks on Tue November 16th 1830

This day begins with squally weather wind from the South steered E.S.E. at 3 P.M. took the wind at west and from that to S.W. steered E.N.E. with a great swell from the N.E. Latter part strong breezes at East steered to the Northward -
So Ends this day Lat 36° 06' Long 53° 00' Cron 52° 18'

Remarks on W November 17th 1830

This day begins with strong gales & squally weather steered to the Northward wind at east at 3 P.M. hove the ship too with a tremendous sea from the N.E. - Middle squalls of rain. wind at East by under short sail steered to the Northward. - Latter light airs and pleasant weather made sail &c -
So Ends this day Lat 37° 01' Long 52° 00'

Remarks on Th November 18th 1830

This day begins with light airs from the East and light squalls of rain Calms &c - at 1 P.M. took the wind at N.E. and squalls of rain - steered to the S.E. Latter part strong gales double reefed the topsails -
So Ends this day Lat 36° 30' Long 52° 26'
