Remarks on M. January 31st 1831

This day begins with light breezes at west
and pleasant weather by S.S.W. sent up
topgallant yards Middle and latter part
strong breezes from the South at N.W.
tacked to westward - So Ends this day
Lat 42° 10' Long 51° 10' Chr 5035 - Green water
Got in fly jib to boom & fore Royal mast

Remarks on Tu. January 1st 1831

First part brisk breezes at S.W. and pleasant
weather - stood to the westward at 9 tacked
by S.S.W. wind S.W. Latter part strong breezes
at N.W. by S.W. under single reefed topsails
at 6 P.M. saw several Right whales
So Ends this day Lat 42° 48' Long 52° 00' Chr 5130

Remarks on W. February 2nd 1831

First part strong breezes at N.W. and
pleasant weather by South - Middle part
wind S.S.W. at 1 P.M. tacked by west -
Latter part wind South by N.W.
So Ends Lat 43° 06' Long 52° 40' Chr 5244

This day begins with light airs at S.W. and
pleasant weather with a great swell
from the South. Middle part quick
breezes at N.W. Latter part strong breezes
at 2 P.M. saw a sperm whale chased
4 hours struck him & drew the iron
So Ends this day Lat 45° 01' Long 55° 03' Chr 5435

Remarks on Sun. February 6th 1831

This day begins with strong breezes
at N.W. and pleasant weather cleared
S.W. Middle part strong gales and
thick weather - Latter ^{part} Calm with Rain
So Ends this day Lat 46° 18' Long 57° 57'
