

Off Cape Horn

Remarks on Mon February 12^d 1831
This day begins with strong breezes
at W.S.W. stood to the Southward
Under single reefed topsails
Middle part Moderate breezes
Latter part Quick breezes at W.N.W.
Heard S.W. by S. to end this day
Lat 56° 14' Long 64° 25' Chr 64° 30'

Remarks on Tue February 13^d 1831
This day begins with light breezes at west
and pleasant at 1 P.M. a large German whaler
came up near the ship got out the
main boat and gave chase. With hours
could not come up with him at 3^o took
up the boats to look in the main boat
wind N.W. Heard S.W. by S.
Middle part Calm. Great swell from the
westward. Latter part strong breezes at
N.N.E. to end this day
Lat 54° 00' Long 66° 00' Chr 66° 08'

Remarks on Wed February 16^d 1831
This day begins with brisk breezes at west
by S.W. with a great sea till the middle
and latter part hard gales from W.N.W.
by S.W. Under a close reefed maintop sail
& spencers. Sent down fore & main
topgallant yard
to end this day no obs Lat 53° 53' Long 66° 30'

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Remarks on 3rd February 17^d 1831
First part hard gales at west by
S.W. Under close reefed maintop sail
and spencers. Middle part wind and
weather much the same. Latter part
more moderate set the foresail & fore
top sail. Spencers to at 10 o'clock in evening
ship wind S.W. by W. to end this day
Cold fingers. Lat 54° 43' Long 66° 40' Chr 66° 48'

Remarks on 4th February 18^d 1831
First part of this day strong gales at
S.W. and equally weather by W.N.W. Under
close reefed topsails. Middle part more
moderate made sail and tore one topsail
Latter part nearly calm unless the fore
top sail to mend one sail in light
at the meridian saw the land bearing 4th
to end this day Lat 56° 04' Long 67° 10' Chr 67° 20'

Remarks on Sat February 19^d 1831
First part of this day light breezes at S.W.
and cloudy weather stood to the westward
at 8 P.M. tacked to the S.E. Cape Horn
bore N.E. by compass 15 miles
Middle part squalls of hail
Latter part good weather tacked to the S.W.
wind W.S.W. at 10 o'clock saw German whaler
going to windward very quick tacked
to the S.E. & got the boats ready but did
not lower
to end this day Lat 56° 40' Long 67° 10'
Chronometer 67° 23'
