Remarks on Th March 24th 1831
First part light airs at South
Heard N.W. at 6th saw the land
East of us a long distance off
Middle part wind the same
Latter part Calm. Saw many
blackfish. put off with the boats
to get five. ^{blister}
So ends this day Lat 24° 11' Long 72° 50'

Remarks on Th March 25th 1831
First part light airs at S.E. Heard
N.W. Latter part Calm saw blackfish
to porpoises. Saw the land ^{in the}
morning. So ends this day Very buff
Boiling blackfish
Lat 23° 51' Long 72° 50' Chr 71° 59'

Remarks on Sat March 26th 1831
First part light airs at west and
pleasant weather by N.W. to S.W.
Middle and latter light winds from
the N.E. Heard N.W.
So ends this day Land in sight at sunrise
Lat 22° 53' Long 72° 08'

Remarks on Sun March 27th 1831
First part light winds at S.E. and
fine pleasant weather. Heard N.W.
Middle to latter part Much the same
Saw a brig standing to the S.W. pointed
ports 
So ends this day Lat 22° 00'

Remarks on Th March 28th 1831
First part light airs at S.E. and fine
weather Heard N.W. Middle part
Much the same. Latter part brisk breezes
at 9 A.M. saw sperm whales at 9 put off
with the boats and got one
So ends this day Lat 20° 56' Long 72° 48'

Remarks on Fri March 29th 1831
First part brisk breezes and fine weather
at 6 P.M. saw sperm whales to finished
cutting - at 5 put off to struck one
got one boat stove and took her up
then got the waist ^{boat stove} all in pieces saved
a little piece of her head lost all the
craft line to save one man badly hurt
Several more lightly. Middle to latter
part wind to weather Much the same
at 8 A.M. got out two new boats
at 9 saw whales right off to got one
So ends this day noon Lat 20° 33' Long 72° 48'

Remarks on W March 30th 1831
First part brisk breezes at S.E. and
pleasant weather at 6 P.M. finished
cutting the whale all the Middle ^{part}
the same at 1 A.M. tacked to the westward
Latter part light winds and fine weather
So ends employed boiling Lat 20° 14' Long 73°

Remarks on Th March 31st 1831
First part light airs at S.E. to fine weather
tackled to the westward Middle to latter
part Much the same at 8 A.M. finished
boiling - saw many blackfish & two boobys
So ends this day Lat 20° 22' Long 73° 06'
