

Coast of Peru

Remarks on Sat April 9th 1831

First part light winds and fine weather at 1 P.M. got the whale alongside at 3 got the boats all on board & began to cut the whale at 1/2 past 6 finished cutting and tacked off shore the land 3 leagues Middle part wind & weather much the same Latter part strong breezes stood in shore Commenced boiling So ends this day Lat 15° 15' the land 15 leagues dist

Remarks on Sun April 10th 1831

First part strong breezes at S.E. and fine weather at 6 P.M. tacked off shore at 2 A.M. tacked in shore at 7 finished boiling Saw many finbacks & porpoises So ends this day Lat 15° 28' the land 4 leagues dist

Remarks on M April 11th 1831

First part brisk breezes at S.E. & E Steered N.E. & W at 4 P.M. hauled by the wind off shore at 2 A.M. tacked in shore at 11 tacked off again Saw Blackfish & finbacks So ends this day Lat 15° 19' the land 4 leagues dist

Pepper

Remarks on Tu April 12th 1831

First part brisk breezes at S.E. & fine weather stood off shore Middle part the same Latter part stood in shore Employed stopping down air So ends this day no obs Lat 15° 44' the land 20 leagues dist

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Remarks on W April 13th 1831

First part brisk breezes at S.E. & fine weather at 6 P.M. tacked off shore at 2 A.M. tacked in shore Latter part Steered N.E. & E Saw many finbacks & humpbacks Black So ends this day finished stopping down the oil Made 90 Barrels

no obs Lat 15° 10' 4 leagues

Remarks on Th April 14th 1831

First part strong breezes at S.E. & fine weather Steered N.E. & W Middle part stood off shore under short sail Latter part Steered N.W. & W Saw nothing remarkable So ends Lat 14° 38' the land 5 leagues dist

Remarks on F April 15th 1831

First part brisk breezes at S.E. and fine weather Steered N.W. & W Unbent foresail & mainsail and bent old ones Middle part headed off shore under short sail Latter part Steered N.E. & W Saw many finbacks water very thick & dirty at the meridian the island of Gallinas bore S.E. & 20 miles dist Lat 13° 42'

Remarks on Sat April 16th 1831

First part strong breezes at S.E. and fine weather Steered N.W. Middle part Steered W.N.W. at daylight in the morning saw two ships & two brigs standing off shore by the wind Latter part Steered N.W. So ends this day Lat 12° 14' Long 79° 14'
