Remarks on Sun April 18th 1831
First part strong winds at S.E.
In fine weather cleared N.W. by W.
Middle to latter part more moderate
cleared the same low and fine back
to ends this day Lat 10° 46' Long 82° 05'

Remarks on Mon April 19th 1831
First part brisk breezes at S.E. & very
fine weather cleared N.W. by W.
Middle to latter part wind & weather
much the same cleared W. by N. ^{was hawk}
saw boobys flying fish alligators & one
to ends this day Lat 9° 40' Long 82° 23'

Many Current Rips
Remarks on Tue April 19th 1831
First part moderate breezes at S.E.
In pleasant weather cleared W. by N.
Middle part the same latter part
some fine rain cleared N.W.
saw many finbacks & small fish
to ends this day employed taring Rigging
Lat 8° 38' Long by Chr 82° 50'

Remarks on Wed April 20th 1831
First part brisk breezes at S.E. and
good weather by N.E. by E. Middle to
latter part by N.E. by E. ^{many small fish}
to ends this day no fish Lat 8° 10' Long 82° 34'

Remarks on Th April 21st 1831
First part light breezes at S.E. and cloudy weather
latter part at 10 tacked off at 2 P.M. tacked
in shore again - ^{and gale} one low broke her back
to ends this day Lat 7° 16' Long 82° 01'
Many Current Rips finbacks &
Black fish

Ship Leonidas by Henry Cleveland

Remarks on Fri April 22nd 1831
First part brisk breezes at S.E. by E. and
fine weather - stood to the Eastward
with all sail to feel very anxious to get
to whole ~~uncommenced~~
Middle part headed off shore with very
pleasant weather - latter part stood
in with all sail - saw a Perry to
windward - at 10 P.M. saw the
weather lobos island - bearing E. by S.
to ends this day Lat 6° 54' Long 82° 19'
saw many mantos very rich

Remarks on Sat April 23rd 1831
First part brisk breezes at S.E. & fine
weather stood in shore at 2 P.M. saw
the sea lobos island bearing N. with
cleared off N.W.
Lainson. Manto very rich.
Middle part headed off shore under
short sail at 1 P.M. saw a brig which
tacked under our lee very near
the ship - latter part cleared
west - struck one several fish
to ends this day Lat 6° 34' Long 82° 20'

Remarks on Sun April 24th 1831
First part light breezes at S.E.
and fine weather stood to the S.W.
at 6 P.M. tacked to the N.E. Middle to latter
part wind and weather much the same
saw one turtle
to ends this day Lat 6° 35' Long 82° 10'
