

Gallapagos Islands. Sea Bay

Remarks on Fri May 27th 1831
First brisk trades to fine weather
Heaved to westward between Albamarle
Is. Rock Pinnacles. Saw a ship to the
Eastward - Is one to westward
at 9 P.M. spoke ship packet
of New Bedford 15 months and 300 barrels
of sperm oil -
Middle part light winds to fine
weather. Latter part strong trades
run into sea bay. President in
Company. So Ends this day

Remarks on Sat May 28th 1831
First part brisk trades to fine
weather worked up off weather
bay - Middle & Latter part run to leeward
Strong weather. Current - saw nothing -
So Ends this day in the Sea Bay

Remarks on Sun May 29th 1831
First part brisk trade wind to fine weather
Heaved to the N.E. Middle light air &
Calms. Strong Current. Letting sight for
Rock Pinnacles - at 11 began to tow
away from the Rock - at half past 3 am
got clear of it - when nearest to the
Rock about one hundred fathoms from
it - with the greatest exertion we got clear
Latter part Heaved N.E. to the north
of the Rock
So Ends this day Lat 30 Miles North
President in Company

Gallapagos Islands

Remarks on Mon May 30th 1831
First light winds and fine weather
Heaved to Eastward - Middle part
light winds to fine weather. Heaved to the
Eastward - at 6 P.M. the Rock bore South
at 6 A.M. the Rock bore S.E.
Latter part brisk breezes at S.E. & E
So Ends this day Lat 28° 30' N Long 91° 30' W

Remarks on Tue May 31st 1831
First part brisk breezes at S.E. to fine
weather. Heaved to the Eastward with
all sail - at 3 P.M. Lat 28° 15' N Long 91° 15' W
Middle part light winds to fair. Latter part
brisk breezes to fine weather - So Ends this day
Lat 1° 18' N Long 90° 50' W. Abington Is. in sight
Bearing S.E. 25 miles

Remarks on Wed June 1st 1831
First part brisk breezes at S.E. to fine weather
Heaved to the Eastward - Middle part the same
at 8 A.M. tacked to the S.W. saw porpoises
at the Meridian. Abington Is. in sight
bearing S.W. 50 or 60 miles distant -
So Ends this day Lat 1° 15' N Long 90° 15' W

Remarks on Thu June 2nd 1831
First part brisk breezes at S.E. to fine
weather. Heaved to the S.W. with all -
at 4 P.M. tacked to the N.E. at 2 A.M. tacked
to the S.W. at 4 tacked to the N.E.
Latter part strong winds at S.E. Very strong
Current letting to the westward -
So Ends this day Lat 5° 20' N
Abington Is. Bearing S.W. 25 miles
