June
5th 1831

Gallapagos Islands
This day begins with brisk breezes
at S.E. & fine weather. Stead to the
Eastward with all sail. Middle part
the same. at 8 A.M. tacked to the S.W.
saw porpoises & Grampian. Caught one
Pillion.
So Ends this day Lat ^{mi} 2° 11' N. Long 89° 53'

Friday
June
6th 1831

First part brisk breezes at S.E. and
cloudy weather cleared to the S.W.
Middle ^{and later} part worked to windward
between downs to Bindloe Island
at the Meridian Downs Lat here
6.18 by Compass Bindloe West 20 miles.
Abington W.N.W. 1/4 W. 65 miles distant
So Ends this day Lat ^{mi} 2° 18' N. Long 90° 18' W.

Sunday
June
5th 1831

First part Moderate breezes S.E. & S. fine
weather. Stead to the S.W. with all sail
James Is. light ahead.
Middle to latter part wind &
weather the same by off to on
East of James Is.
Saw many porpoises & blackfish.
So Ends this day Lat 00° 03' S.

Monday
June
6th 1831

First part brisk trades & fine weather
by on different tacks off east End
James Is. Middle to latter part
much the same. Saw many blackfish.
So Ends this day Lat 00° 00'

Gallapagos Islands

Friday
June
7th 1831

First part Moderate tacked one way
and the other between James &
Bindloe Islands. Middle to latter
part the same. Saw blackfish.
So Ends this day Lat ^{mi} 2° 00' N. Long 90° 30' W.
Perdices Is. lies in 90° 24' W. Long

W. June
8th 1831

First part brisk breezes at East to fine
weather. Stead off to on James Is.
Middle to latter light winds. Blackfish
So Ends no lat. no long. no whales

Th.
June
9th 1831

Begins with good weather & leading
breezes at East. Middle calm.
Latter part good breezes. So Ends
Saw blackfish & porpoises.

F.
June
10th 1831

Commences with good breezes to fine
weather. Stead to the N.E. for
Bindloe Is. Middle part the
same. Latter part Stead to westward.
So Ends this day. no Lat. no Everything

Sat. June
11th 1831

First part brisk breezes at S.E.
to fine weather. Employed heaving
to windward for James Island
Harbour.
Middle part by off to on. at 8 A.M.
Came to anchor in 7 fathoms water
at James Island harbour.
So Ends this day
