 Aug 23rd 1831 Coasts of Peru Kept by
 First part strong winds & very
 rough. Chased whales all the afternoon
 at 6 finished boiling
 Middle & Latter part strong wind
 & very rough. stood to the eastward
 Under Double Reefed topsails at noon
 saw sperm whales going Perry Quin
 to windward
 So Ends this day Lat 3° 48' Long 81° 30'

No 24
 August 1831 First part strong winds at South
 & tolerably clear. Middle & Latter part
 more moderate at 4 P.M. tacked off
 shore land in sight. Spoke bark
 Minerva Capt Price
 at 7 A.M. saw sperm whales heads
 to leeward down boats to the whales
 turned to windward could
 not come up with them
 4 ships in sight 3 of them among
 whales one was Minerva & one
 was the Winstow
 So Ends this day Lat 3° 53' Long 82°

No 25th
 Aug 25th 1831 First part brisk breezes at South
 & smoky weather stood to the
 westward - at 3 tacked to the East
 stood in all night. at 8 tacked to
 the westward. saw 2 ships
 So Ends this day Lat 3° 56' Long 82° 10'

No 26th
 August 1831 Begins with brisk breezes at
 South & smoky weather stood to
 the Eastward with all sail
 Middle part stood off part of the
 night with double reefed topsails
 latter part strong winds stood to
 the Eastward land in sight
 spoke bark Osprey of New Bedford
 1150 bbls. saw hump backs
 So Ends this day Lat 4° 10' Long 81° 24'

No 27th
 Aug 27th 1831 Begins with strong winds at S.W.
 stood to the S.E. at 5 P.M. tacked
 off shore the land 6 miles distant
 stood off all the middle & Latter
 part with some fog saw 6 ships
 Boiling. saw hump & finbacks
 So Ends this day Lat 4° 38' Long 82° 00'

No 28th
 August 1831 Begins with moderate breezes at
 S.W. & good weather stood off shore
 saw 11 ships. saw 11
 Middle & Latter part stood in shore with
 pleasant breezes & some fog saw three
 ships - saw many several fish & some
 finbacks. So ends this day Lat 4° 38' Long 81° 30'

No 29th
 August 1831 Begins with brisk breezes at South
 & some fog. tacked N.W. Middle
 part headed off shore with three
 topsails. Latter part stood in shore
 at 4 A.M. spoke ship Erie
 of New port 2000 bbls. Capt Adams
 badly hurt with a whale went on board
 & supplied him some medicine
 So Ends Lat 4° 05' Long 82° 00'
