 W 2nd 1831 Strong breeze at South. In good
 weather stood to the Eastward
 Middle & Latter part much the same.
 Tacked off at 10 P.M. tacked in at 11
 saw nothing but flocks
 to end this day Lat 30° 14' Long 81° 42'

Th 3rd 1831 Breeze with strong winds to rough
 weather stood to the Eastward under
 single reefed topsails. Middle part
 strong winds to very rough at 9 P.M.
 tacked off shore. Latter part more moder-
 ate. Saw blackish finbacks to the ship standing
 to end this day Lat 30° 15' Long 82° 4'

Fr 4th 1831 Breeze with brisk breezes to cloudy weather
 stood off shore under single reefed topsails
 Middle & Latter part much the same
 at 10 P.M. tacked to the Eastward
 saw nothing remarkable
 to end this day Lat 30° 11' Long 82° 56'

Sat 5th 1831 First part brisk breezes to cloudy
 weather stood to the Eastward
 at 9 P.M. saw sperm whales put off
 to get one small one after drawing from
 4 or 5 to parting from one
 to end this day no obs Lat 30° 15' Long 82° 56'

Sun 6th 1831 Breeze with brisk breezes to fine weather but in
 the middle to the Eastward
 at 10 P.M. tacked to the Westward
 at 10 A.M. tacked to the East
 saw one ship
 to end this day **ENDED**
 Lat 30° 15' Long to account 82° 56'

Henry Cleveland Ship Leonidas
 M 12th 1831 Breeze with light breezes at South to
 cloudy weather stood to the Eastward
 at 4 P.M. finished sailing and spoke
 ship Logan 450 barrels oil
 Middle part light winds with fog
 at 2 P.M. tacked to the Westward at 4
 tacked to the Eastward. Saw ship Logan
 standing to the Westward
 to end this day Lat 30° 16' Long 83° 00'

Th 13th 1831 Breeze with brisk breezes at South
 to some fog stood to the East with all
 sail. Middle & Latter part wind
 to weather the same. Stood off
 part of the night
 at half past 4 P.M. saw a large
 sperm whale went down to side
 him no more at 8 P.M. Common
 blowing down oil
 to end this day Lat 30° 06' Long 82° 40'

W 14th 1831 Breeze with brisk breezes at South
 to good weather at 1 P.M. saw
 sperm whales put off to get two
 at 4 got them along side
 to went to throwing down again
 at 4 A.M. saw more whales put off
 with the boats to get one at 10 A.M.
 began to cut. Sailed Lat 29° 26' Long 83° 00'

Fri 15th 1831 Breeze with brisk breezes at South to thick
 weather at half past 2 P.M. finished cutting
 to began to boil. Middle & Latter part
 strong winds with fog at 12 P.M. &
 tacked to the Eastward. Saw many
 porpoises
 to end this day Lat 29° 12' Long 83° 11'
